



What a year it has been with the Summit Association of Churches. Our focus over the past 2 years has been building and growing relationships and giving a reason for being a part of an association of churches. In summary, answering the "why" of associating. Here are a few "reasons"...

- This past year we have seen an increase in joint fellowships where 8-10 congregations have been represented through pastoral dinners, association picnics / gatherings, and participating events.
- Last Christmas, we provided thousands of stocking stuffer toys for at least 6 of our congregations.







- In the spring, our association sponsored a portion of a 5K walk / run with Connect Church to provide mission funds for their youth group to minister alongside of an association outside of Ashville, NC.
- In the summer, we engaged multiple attendees of the Summit County Fair along with providing school supplies to over 7 congregations and ministries. I also had the privilege to officiate the wedding of Peter and Tiffany Hodge at Central Community Church. In a moment we will celebrate their baptisms.







- As an association, we have assisted our Romanian brother, Pastor Mihai Cabau's daughter with remaining in the US as a student by contributing to her school semester funds. I have been able to assist in a pastoral ordination and deacon ordination, as well as, working with pastoral search teams.
- In September, Pastor Robert Hale and I flew to the Florida Keys and met with 8 of 12 congregations to encourage partnership and strengthen relationships. On October 5, at the Florida Keys Baptist Association, they agreed to partner in ministry and missions with us as well.



These are just a few reasons to partner with the Summit Association of Churches. I am currently pursuing other likeminded congregations to partner with their strengths to assist us in becoming a greater Kingdom Impact in our region.

The next two years we will continue to build our relationships, but also focus on strategic partnership! Thank you for allowing me to be a co-laborer alongside of you to the glory of God and for His Kingdom alone.

CREDENTIALS POLICY

Whereas, We believe that Summit Baptist Association is a voluntary cooperation, not a cooperation that is coerced or a result of external pressures.

Whereas, We believe that the purpose of such committee as ours is to address and recommend to the body so that sensitive issues do not have to be hashed out on the floor of the annual meeting.

Whereas, We believe that the leadership is a privilege of those who demonstrate the highest level of commitment to an organization in time, talents, and treasures and stewardship means responsibility and ownership.

Whereas, It is the desire of this Credentials Committee that churches be *restored* to fellowship not *removed* from it.

Whereas, Our constitution states:

ARTICLE V - AFFILIATION Section 1: This Association shall be composed only of Churches who demonstrate their loyalty to and cooperation with the Southern Baptist Convention and the State Convention of Baptists in Ohio (affiliated with the Southern Baptist Convention) as they work together in the cause of **Christ.**

Whereas, We believe that the following criteria should be a frame work, not a task master, for determining what constitutes "loyalty" and "cooperation."

- Regular giving to both the association and cooperative program
- Regular attendance at associational and SCBO functions such as Executive Committee, Pastor Fellowship, Pastor's network, State Evangelism Celebration, State Convention, Associational Annual Meeting
- Regular reporting of Annual Church Profile (ACP)
- The demonstration of integrity of leadership within the church that doesn't damage the reputation of Christ and/or the congregations within our association.

We motion to the messengers of the annual meeting that the churches on the attached list be considered churches of our association. In addition, churches with an asterisk (*) do not fulfill the above requirements and are considered watch care churches having the benefits of the association without voting privileges.

CONSTITUTION OF THE SUMMIT BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I - NAME

This body shall be called the Summit Baptist Association.

ARTICLE II - DECLARATION OF FAITH

The Declaration of Faith of this Association shall be the same as "The Baptist Faith and Message" (2000).

ARTICLE III - PURPOSE

The Summit Baptist Association exists to advance God's kingdom by resourcing churches and church plants through its relationships.

ARTICLE IV - AUTHORITY

The Association shall recognize the legislative, judicial, and ecclesiastical autonomy of each member Church.

ARTICLE V - AFFILIATION

- Section 1: This Association shall be composed of churches whose doctrine and practice aligns with the Association's declaration of faith, who regularly participate in Association events, and who provide the Association with an Annual Church Report.
- Section 2: This Association reserves the right to reject Messengers from any Church which shows itself to be unorthodox in faith or practice, or which willfully and persistently creates discord by refusing to comply with the spirit of this Constitution.

ARTICLE VI - ASSOCIATION MINISTRY COUNCIL

- Section 1: This Association shall, at each Annual Meeting, elect members of the Association Ministry Council (AMC) who will serve as officers, nominators, and trustees of the Association.
- Section 2: The duties of the members of the AMC shall be determined by the members of the AMC, including but not limited to Church Planting Resource Leader, Church Strengthening Resource Leader, Moderator/President, Clerk/Secretary, Statutory Agent, and Treasurer.

ARTICLE VII - EXECUTIVE BOARD

- Section 1: This Executive Board (EB) shall be composed of the Pastor and one (1) lay member determined by each church and reported to the Association.
- Section 2: The EB shall be responsible for all business of the Association except that which is otherwise granted in this document. It shall hold at least two regular meetings annually, announced at least thirty days in advance. Business may be conducted, including by written or electronic communication, outside of regular meetings.
 - Section 3: A quorum for the EB shall be those present.

ARTICLE VIII - ANNUAL MEETING

Section 1: Messengers to the Annual Meeting shall be determined by their respective Church and reported to the association.

Section 2:	Each Church of one hundred members or less shall be entitled to two Messengers and one additional Messenger for every additional 100 members, not to exceed five (5) Messengers.
Section 3:	Each person employed by the Association shall submit an annual report at the Annual Meeting.
Section 4:	The budget of the Association shall be affirmed at each annual meeting.
Section 5:	Roberts Rules of Order will govern all business sessions.
Section 6:	A quorum for the Annual Meeting shall be 25% of affiliated churches.
Section 7:	The date and time for the Annual meeting shall be communicated at the previous Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE IX -- CHANGE OF CONSTITUTION

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority of Messengers present and voting at any Annual Meeting, provided such amendments be recommended by the Executive Board.


